Roscoe Pollitt was born in Indianola, IL on May 5, 1915. He was united in marriage to Grace Rice on November 10, 1934. To this union 3 daughters were born. They resided on a farm and Roscoe raised hogs. In 1950 they moved to Iowa where he worked at three different hog operations.

In 1965 he began his personal hog operation southwest of Truro. The farm is currently owned by Larry Wisecup. He also worked at the Truro Grain Elevator and drove a school bus for the Interstate 35 Schools.

In 1970 Roscoe and Grace lived east of town along the Truro highway. Two years later they moved to his current residence which was formerly owned by the Jim Dorman family and Larry Smith family. Many times you would see them mowing their 3 acres with lawn mowers.

Roscoe and Grace were married for 68 ½ years before her passing. They had a happy life and did much traveling until their health became a problem.

Roscoe enjoys his family (3 children, 5 grandchildren, 5 step grandchildren, 11 great grandchildren, 7 step great grandchildren, 6 great-great grandchildren and 1 great-great step grandchild.

Step3

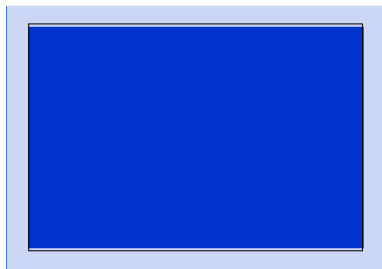
Offer the carolers snacks such as foil-wrapped chocolate candy, hot cocoa and Christmas cookies.

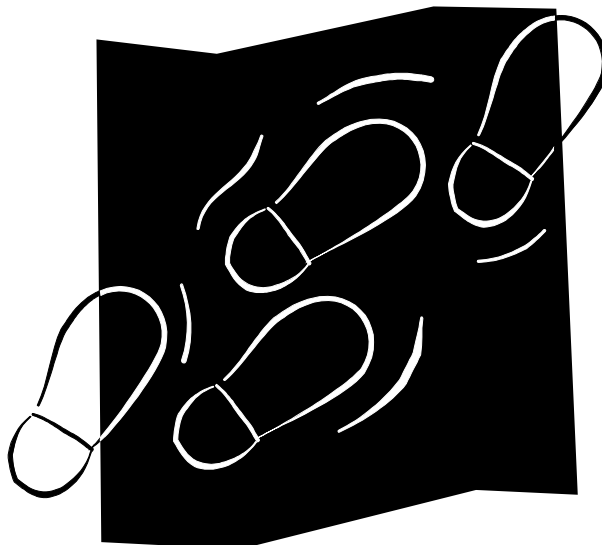
A listing of names and titles of managers in your organization is a good way to give your newsletter a personal touch. If your organization is small, you may want to list the names of all employees.
