Septembers background picture is from top of a hill on the Mease farm West of Truro. As we get closer to the harvest of another crop, we look at the elevator. In 1953 a Quonset* was built at the East end of Main (Center) Street. In 1954 a first grain leg** was added to the elevator system. In

1976 a new office and warehouse was added along with additional services including seed sales, fertilizer, chemicals, feed and milling. Truro Grain is now owned by Swackhammer Inc.

*A Quonset hut is a lightweight prefabricated structure of corrugated galvanised iron having a semicircular cross section. The design was based on the Nissen hut developed by the British during World War I. The name comes from their site of first manufacture.

**The leg towers are designed to support chain loop systems between grain bins. Grain Leg Towers and catwalks are custom built for grain handling facilities.
